On Wednesday the 3rd of May some of the U6 played a select XV from Coleraine Rugby Club which included some of teachers including Mr Stewart, Mr Patterson Jr, Mr Irwin, Mr Palmer, Dr Hull and former teacher Mr McLaughlin. The game started well with Coleraine's pack settling quickly and carried forward a lot of ball. Within a short period of time Coleraine took the lead with a try, using their pack to rumble over the line. Inst replied with a period of possession, but turnovers caused the school side to lose any momentum that they had worked hard to build up. Coleraine were taking a lot of the 50:50 balls causing the club side to have a greater share of the possession. Coleraine soon scored again after the ball was turned over from an Inst scrum leading to the club making a large break into the Inst half. After a couple of phases Coleraine added another try through missed tack-

les and some poor defending.

The second half brought changes to both sides, bringing on several fresh pairs of legs. Coleraine continued to dominate both up front and in the backs and were rewarded 15 minutes into the half with a try scored out on the wing. Coleraine failed to convert the conversion but were well ahead at 15-0. Inst did come back at Coleraine and after some quick ball from a scrum; Colin Daly made a break down the centre of the pitch giving Inst the perfect field position. However, Inst failed to use this position to launch another attack and further pressurising the Coleraine defence. Coleraine extended their lead after another break, fast ball being won they threw the ball out wide to the wing and crossed over for another try, the score now 20-0. After some exchanges in possession and both teams running with the ball,
